## The gradual and immidiate decline of fruit and landscape trees

Cultivar, soil fertility and climatic conditions affect the growth and fruiting conditions of trees. Unsuitability of these conditions will cause that the trees can not have their standard life span and the growth will be affected by limiting factor. The cause for immediate decline of trees will be compared with the gradual decline of trees which will be caused by limiting factor.

The high content of air pollution will cause a dramatic change in absorbtion of gases through the stomato into the leaves that finally will change the amount of leaf enzy contemt. Such dramatic modification finally will after the amount of photosynthesis, respiration and evapotranspiration, that final in the long run will be disturbance of tree leaves that are actually the main body of the trees.
