Preliminary studies of persimmon cultivars in Varamin

In this studies four cultivars of persimmon are evaluated. These cultivars produce parthenocrapic fruits which morphologically are different. All these cultivars grafted on *D. lotus* as rootstock.

- 1. Japoni-Irani cv.: fruit in this cultivar is a stringent and cubic in shape with average fruit weight 125g and tree shape is upright. It is succeptible to sun burn.
- 2. Hashikaki cv.: it bears round and yelloish fruit, with average fruit weight 210g and dose not have alternative bearing.
- 3. Fud coax cv.: it bears good fruit with average fruit weight 140-150g. Fruit is non-astringent and tree shape is upright. It is heavy bearing cultivar. Numerous sucker are produced from rootstock which must be removed annually.
- 4. Kharmandi ev. (D. lotus): It bears small fruits which are not parthenocrap and mostly is used as rootstock because it grows well in different types of soil. It has good compatibility with commercial cultivars.
